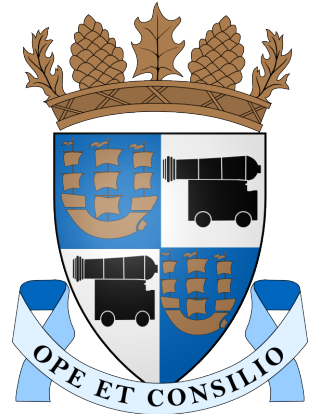

# Aims of the Consultation

1. Following a presentation by the developers at August's PCC meeting, both Cruden Homes and Barratt Homes were keen to get feedback on the proposed designs for the Baileyfield site.
  
2. PCC agreed to undertake a snap consultation to:
  - 2.1. Raise awareness of the proposals
  - 2.2. Encourage engagement with the designs
  - 2.3. Gather responses and feed those back to the developer, elected reps and planning department

The consultation ran from Wednesday, 2 Sept to Sunday, 6 Sept.

## Cruden / Barratt Design Consultation

Property developers Cruden Homes and Barratt Homes have published design details for the housing they are proposing for the Baileyfield site.

Cruden Homes are to seek design approval for a single block of 52 housing units on Fishwives Causeway. The flats will be 1 and 2-bedroom and a mix of tenures offered through Port of Leith Housing Association.

Barratt Homes have drawn up design proposals for 105 units, a mixture of town houses and colony style houses.

Since planning permission has already been given in principle, both developers will shortly be seeking approval for the details of the design, the landscaping, car and cycle parking, and the materials proposed.










The main consultation page on the PCC website received more than 400 clicks over the period, with users spending nearly 5 minutes on average considering the materials.

# Responses / Comments



**Justin Kenrick** As Alastair Tibbitt says, there's a lack of cycle paths, especially given this is the main route into town. I've just submitted the following to the [Baileyfield](#) site consultation at <http://www.portobelloc.org/bcb.php?ref=pcc>

Fishwives Causeway is the major cycle route into the centre of town from Portobello. Adding all these homes and cars and pedestrians to this street without providing dedicated cycle lanes would be unhelpful, dangerous and go against the need to encourage non-carbon, healthy transport. For this development to go ahead it needs to take on board the need to support, rather than impede, green transport.

A major issue for those living in flats/ tenements in Portobello is the lack of secure and covered bicycle storage facilities. This leads to people either not using bikes or parking them in the stairs in a way that obstructs neighbours. Ensuring sufficient secure and covered bicycle storage facilities in this development is crucial.

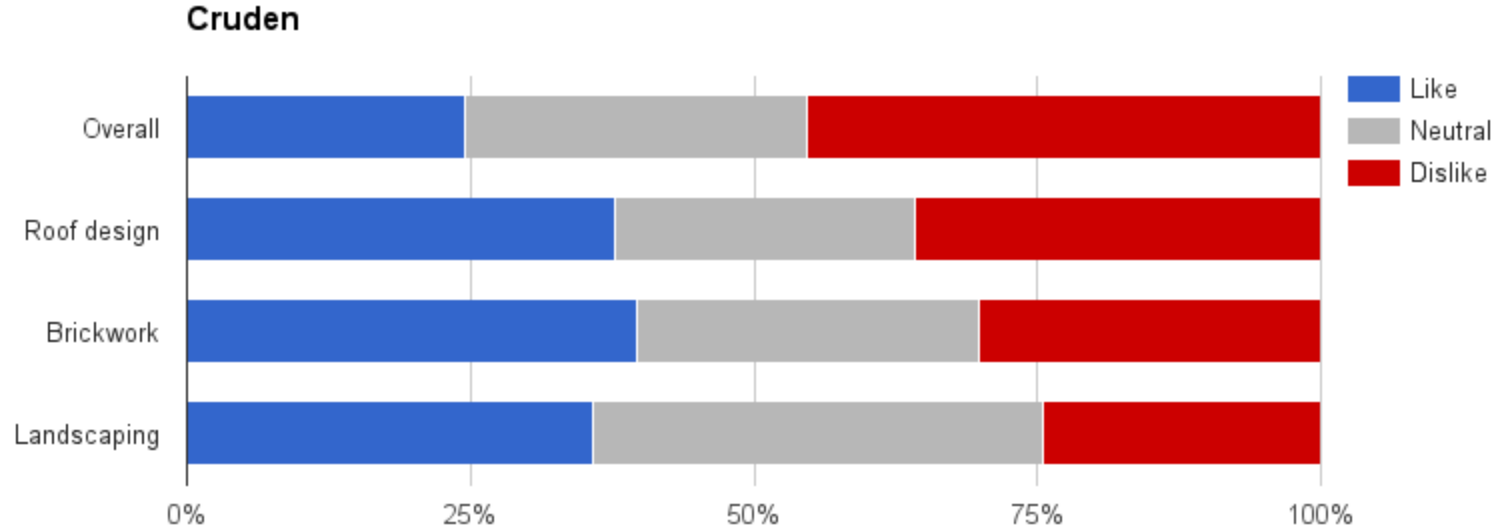

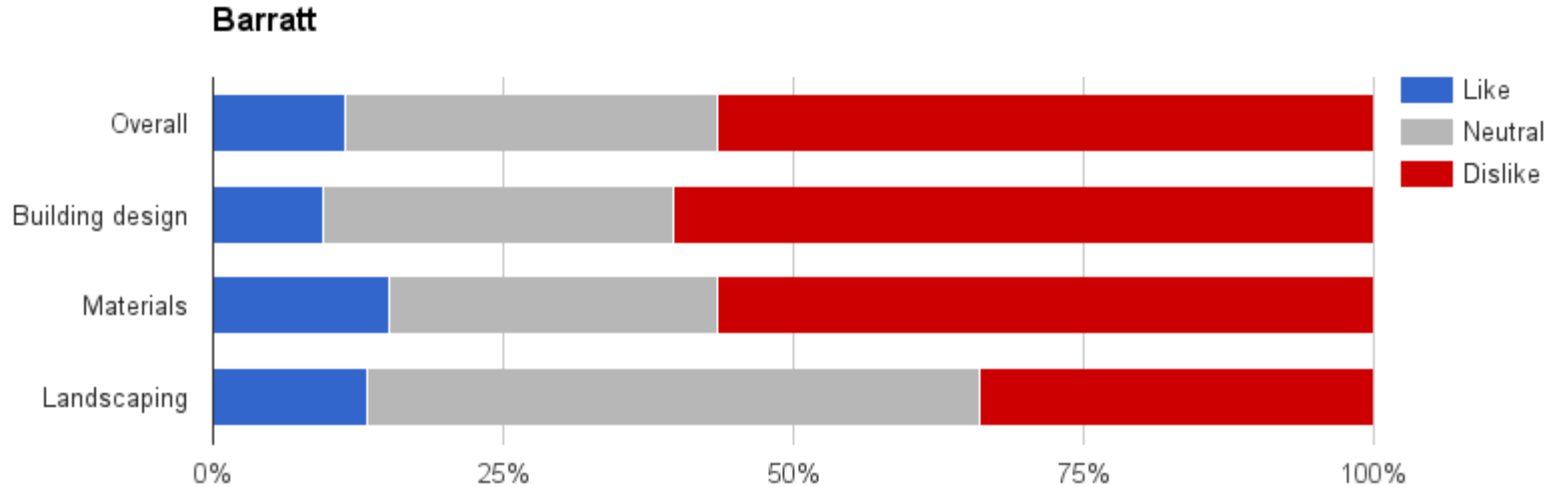
